**APSA Political Psychology Section Preconference, August 30, 2017**

The Political Psychology Section of the American Political Science Association invites interested scholars to submit abstracts for posters to be presented at the 2017 Political Psychology Preconference at the University of California, Berkeley.

There will be two poster sessions during the course of the pre-conference. Each poster will be assigned a discussant, who will provide feedback to the author(s). These sessions will be scheduled with no concurrent events to provide poster presenters with good opportunities to gain feedback on their projects from multiple pre-conference attendees.

We will make decisions on poster acceptances by June 9.
