## Call for Papers for a Meta-Analysis on Conspiracy Beliefs and (Dis-) Trust

Dear Colleagues,

We are conducting a meta-analysis on the link between conspiracy beliefs and (dis)trust. We have already performed an extensive literature search and we are now seeking any unpublished work including unpublished data or manuscripts (e.g., work in press or in progress), book chapters not listed on common electronic databases, dissertations, and conference papers. We are also looking for student data and published data sets which measured (but did not report) the variables in question.

To be included, studies must include:

(a) A quantitative assessment of conspiracy beliefs (any form of explicit measurement), and

(b) A quantitative assessment of trust/ distrust (any form of explicit measurement).

We include correlational, and longitudinal examinations of these relationships. If you have carried out experimental research in this field, we would also be pleased if you contact us. If you have unpublished research that meets these criteria, we would greatly appreciate if you could send us

- a) Either the aggregated statistics (i.e. correlation between the two measurements) or
- b) The raw data

plus a verbatim description of how trust and conspiracy beliefs were measured by July 30st, 2018 to the following email address <u>pia.lamberty@uni-mainz.de</u>

We also welcome any pointers to published work that meets these criteria as a way to double-check that we do not miss relevant works.
