We are pleased to announce that the submission system for applications to present a poster at the fourth annual APSA Political Psychology pre-conference is now open.

The political psychology pre-conference will take place on Wednesday, August 29, 2018, the day before the start of APSA, at Harvard University. We are planning on a slate of four to five speakers, from both psychology and political science (Jim Sidanius and Mina Cikara have already confirmed), who will present their work throughout the day. We are also planning a roundtable discussion that will focus on new work in political psychology.

We will have two poster sessions during the course of the preconference. Each poster will be assigned a discussant, who will provide feedback to the author(s). These sessions will be scheduled with no concurrent events, with the hopes that poster presenters will have some good opportunities to get feedback on their projects from multiple pre-conference attendees.

The deadline for submissions is May 25.

We plan to make decisions on poster acceptances by June 1.

In the event that we receive way more applications than we can accept, please note that preference will be given to members of the APSA Political Psychology section.

We will have a terrific slate of presentations, and the event will offer good opportunities for networking as well. As APSA gets so much bigger, it seems harder to get the kinds of one-on-one interactions and networking opportunities that are such an important part of conferences.
