Mukadder Okuyan is a social psychologist whose research examines discrimination and social change from the perspective of both advantaged and disadvantaged groups members. She is currently focusing on the antecedents and consequences of perceived discrimination among advantaged group members in the U.S. and Germany. Her published work reveals insights about the consequences of multiple marginalization for feminist activism and HIV research, functions of racism discourse for right-wing populism, and psychology of collective action. Throughout her work, she focuses on how group status, multiple social identities and ideology affects people's attitudes and perceptions. She is currently teaching at Acibadem University in Istanbul, Turkey.
