

## **Open Competition for the 2017 Special Issue of *Political Psychology***

Applications are invited for the guest editorship of a special issue of *Political Psychology*. The special issue will be completed in 2016 and published in 2017.

Proposals should be for 8-10 articles each of up to 9,000 words in length, including an editorial overview. Proposals should be concise: no longer than 1,000 words. Proposals may come from practitioners as well as academics and are equally welcome from new or more established scholars. The proposal should include a clear account of the topic and research question, time plan, names of contributors (proposed or confirmed), provisional titles and brief abstracts. Full abstracts are not required at this stage but the proposers should indicate the state of the project and whether any of the manuscripts exist in draft versions.

The deadline for the submissions of proposals is April 15, 2016. Submissions should be emailed to [Politicalpsychology@svet.lu.se](mailto:Politicalpsychology@svet.lu.se). The successful team will be informed by May 15, 2016.

The decision of the selection panel is final and there will be no appeal process.

The successful guest editor(s) will have a substantial role in the editorial process and will work closely with the editorial office to find reviewers and managing any consequent revisions.
