The Foundation for the Rights of Future Generations (FRFG) and the Intergenerational Foundation (IF) invite entries for the seventh Intergenerational Justice Prize. Prizes totalling €10,000, funded by the Stiftung Apfelbaum, will be awarded to the best papers submitted.

In the late 1960s the dissatisfaction of younger generations over the state of society famously found expression in various youth protest movements that had a profound impact on many of the nations where they took place. In subsequent decades youth activism seemed to wither away.

Today, however, young people worldwide are once again taking to the streets and making themselves heard – in student marches and climate activism, in the Occupy movement, the Spanish "iDemocracia Real YA!", the Arab Spring and the recent uprisings at Taksim Square in Istanbul,

The Intergenerational Justice Prize is primarily aimed at young academics (undergraduates, graduates, PhD students), but is open to all who take a similarly academic approach to their writing. The submission of group projects is also welcome.
