

Dear ISPP members,

Apologies for cross posting. Michael Wohl and I are conducting a meta-analysis examining the relationship between social identity components (i.e., centrality, ingroup ties, and ingroup affect) and health. We are writing to request from you **unpublished** data (from manuscripts in press, in the review process, or in preparation, as well as theses/dissertations) you may have for inclusion in the meta-analysis. The inclusion criteria for the meta-analysis are:

- 1- Cross-sectional or longitudinal correlational research (no experiments).
- 2- The research measured social identification with a group (e.g., race, ethnicity, sexual orientation) using one of the following scales:

- 3- Included a measure of health, broadly construed (self-report, behavioral, or biological).
- 4- Work written up in languages other than English will be included if the authors of that work can provide us with necessary information needed for meta-analysis.

We would greatly appreciate it if you could share any studies that fit these selection criteria. We would also appreciate it if you could circulate this request to your networks or any colleagues who may be able to assist.
