

Charles L. Brewer Distinguished Teaching of Psychology Award

\$4,000 to recognize a significant career of contributions of a psychologist who is an exceptional teacher of psychology.

This award recognizes a significant career of contributions of a psychologist who has a proven track record as an exceptional teacher of psychology. The awardee receives a plaque, a \$4,000 award and an all-expense paid round trip to the APA Annual Convention, where the award is presented. Awardees are also invited to give a special address.

Eligibility Criteria

Nominees should demonstrate and will be rated on the following dimensions:

- Have demonstrated achievement related to the teaching of psychology
- Exemplary performance as a classroom teacher
- Development of innovative curricula and courses
- Development of effective teaching methods and/or materials
- Teaching of advanced research methods and practice in psychology
- Administrative facilitation of teaching
- Research on teaching
- Training of teachers of psychology
- Evidence of influence as a teacher of students who become psychologists

APF encourages nominations for individuals who represent diversity in race, ethnicity, gender, age, disability and sexual orientation.

Nomination Requirements

- Nomination cover letter outlining the nominee's contributions to the teaching of psychology.
- Current CV and bibliography.
- Up to ten supporting letters from colleagues, administrators and former students.
- An appendix of no more than two to three supporting documents.
- A one to three page statement of teaching philosophy from the nominee.
- All nomination materials must be gathered by the nominator and submitted online.
