

PhD Scholarship on Political Determinants of Migration

A fully funded PhD position (including fees and a €16,000 yearly stipend for four years) is available at the Department of Political Science, Trinity College Dublin, working under the supervision of Dr Michelle D'Arcy. Students will address an important question related to migration, which could include the political psychology of migration decisions, the effect of country level political factors in origin countries such as politicised ethnicity, corruption or democratisation on migration flows. The ideal candidate will have a solid grounding in quantitative methods as well as an openness to mixed method approaches, substantive knowledge of one developing region, and an interest in exploring this important topic in a holistic manner that seeks to uncover the underlying political factors that shape voluntary and involuntary migration.
