The Department of Psychology at the University of Sheffield is seeking to appoint a Post-Doctoral Research Associate to work on a project investigating the impact of political humour on individuals' emotions, political attitudes, and political behaviour.

The project is funded by an Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC) Research Grant, which is led by Dr. Aarti Iyer (Department of Psychology) in collaboration with Prof. Maria Grasso (Department of Politics) and Prof. Charles Pattie (Department of Politics).

The post is fixed-term for 36 months, with a start date of 1 April 2019 or soon after.

The deadline to submit an online application is 2 January 2019 (23:59 GMT).

The successful candidate will hold (or be about to obtain) a PhD in social psychology, political psychology, political science, or a related discipline. You will be familiar with the research literature in one or more of the following areas: (political) attitudes, emotion, collective action, political behaviour. Experience is essential in: designing and conducting quantitative experiments in various settings (e.g., lab, online, field); managing large data-sets; and advanced quantitative analytic techniques (e.g., factor analysis, moderation and mediation analyses in Multiple Regression, Structural Equation Modelling, Multilevel Modelling).
